

Distribution of Taxes to Counties

Motor Vehicle Collections (Title 47 §1104)

(HB 2189 eff. 10/1/2000 changes %'s annually, Hold harmless Schools, counties and cities)

- A) First \$ off the top an apportioned to the following funds: (Various Titles and Sections)
 - 1) Oklahoma Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund.
 - 2) Public Safety Revolving Fund.
 - 3) Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Fund
 - 4) Motor Vehicle Driver Education Fund
 - 5) Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund
 - 6) Oklahoma Tax Commission Fund
 - 7) Universities
 - 8) Adaptive Grant Program for Oklahomans with Mental Retardation
 - 9) Others?
- B) 36.2% of remaining goes to school districts (FY 2002, 35.91%)
- C) 44.84% of remaining goes to General Revenue Fund (FY 2002, 45.29%)
- D) 0.31% of remaining goes to the State Transportation Fund (FY 2002, 0.31%)
- E) 7.24% of remaining goes to the counties' County Highway fund (FY 2002, 7.18%)
 - 1) 40% of funds prorated by County Road mileage/Total State county road mileage
 - 2) 60% of funds
 - a) 50% prorated by County Area/Total State area
 - b) 50% prorated by Total County Population/Total State Population
(The total county population is used)
- F) 2.59% of remaining goes to the counties' Special Revenue fund, County Road fund, by the CR factor (FY 2002, 2.56%)
- G) 3.62% of remaining goes to the counties' County Highway fund by the CR factor (FY 2002, 3.59%)
- H) 0.83% of remaining goes to counties' General fund for county government (FY 2002, 0.82%)
- I) 3.10% of remaining goes to cities and towns (FY 2002, 3.08%)
- J) 1.24% of remaining goes to Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement fund (FY 2002, 1.23%)
- K) 0.03% of remaining goes to Wildlife Conservation fund

Motor Vehicle Collections (Title 47 §1104)

Overall counties received 14.98% of the motor vehicle collections.

- In FY 2002 counties received \$85,943,472 out of \$573,771,374
